For the next two days I would like you to review the passages of Isaiah that have to do with what it will be like during the Millennial Kingdom. I would like you to write down in each of the references just what you would expect to see if you are going to be there. Remember that this is something we've already done in Isaiah Parts 1 and 2, and should be written in your Appendix D (for every thing you learned about the Millennium), but I want you to review it again, so that you have a more complete understanding of what it will be like during the Millennial Kingdom.

# Days 3-5: Isaiah 25-27 passages concerning the Great Tribulation & the Millennial Kingdom

Obviously in Isaiah chapters 25 through 27, we not only see glimpses of the Millennial Kingdom, but also pictures of the latter stages of the Tribulation period before Christ returns to earth for the second time and sets up His Kingdom. I have wrestled and wrestled with these three chapters for a whole week now as to how to view them so that they make sense. After backing off from the details and viewing them as a grouping, I believe this passage is best seen as though we are already present in the Millennial

Kingdom and we are reminiscing into the recent past of the Tribulation Period. Dr. J. Vernon McGee believed "in that day" was referring to the last days or the time of the Tribulation, Millennial Kingdom and beyond into eternity. What I would like you to do for the last three days of this week's lesson is to read and reread Isaiah 25-27 and attribute what Isaiah says to either reminiscing about the time of trouble before Jesus' return to the earth to set up His Kingdom or to the time when the Millennial Kingdom has already been firmly established. Doing this exercise will give us more information as to what it will be like during the Great Tribulation and what is yet to transpire for God's people in the Millennial Kingdom. You will do this exercise below by writing your ideas about these passages.

I would also like you to work on your double-spaced worksheets for Isaiah 25-27 in the appendix: Please mark every "in that day" in the same manner that you marked this phrase in Isaiah, Parts 1 and 2. Add these to your list of references for "in that day" found in either Appendix A or Appendix D, whichever is appropriate. Then, I would like you to mark all words that indicate time with a clock out to the left side in the margin. For example, "long ago," "never," "all time," etc. Do you find any names of God that you can attribute to the Messiah in this passage of Scripture and add these to Appendix C for Messianic prophesies, if appropriate. Be sure to mark the "serpent" in the same manner as you marked him in Isaiah 14. Hint: the serpent in Isaiah 27 is the same as the "star of the morning" or the "son of the dawn" in Isaiah 14. See if you can find several contrasts in chapter 26, i.e., the righteous and the wicked, the dead will not live versus the dead will live. Do you see a play-on-words in chapter 25:10-12? What city could God be referring to in 25:2 and 26:5-6? Two final questions: where do you think you will view the Great Tribulation and where do you think you will be during the Millennial Kingdom?
