Last week in our discussion, we contrasted the disobedience of both kingdoms of Israel and the obedience of the remnant of Israel, mainly, those who were left in Jerusalem. This week, we will see once again the great distance between the hearts of the Israelites and the Holy One of Israel. We will view the great tendency of the Israelites to put their trust in someone or something else other than the LORD their God. The rebellious Israelites will not consider His authority over them and what is worse, they openly defy Him, saying they do not want to hear any more about the Holy One of Israel!

## Day 1 – Text Worksheets on Isaiah 30 and 31

Please read Isaiah 30 and 31 and work on your double-spaced worksheets for these chapters. Mark key words and key repeated phrases. I marked woe, oracle, rebellious, on that day and in that day, voice. Are there any references to the Messiah? Can you pick out any verses that are clearly in the Millennial Kingdom? Can you make any lists in the margins? Look for the points in Isaiah 30 that tell what a rebellious child is like.

Why did their rebellion grieve God so very much? See Isaiah 30:1.

What did God declare the shelter in the shadow of Egypt to be because of their rebelliousness? See Isaiah 30:3.

What did the Israelites send to Egypt by which they might buy some protection from them? Who were the people who cannot profit the Israelites? See Isaiah 30:6.

How could the Israelites be saved from their oppressors, the Assyrians? See Isaiah 30:15.

How can we be saved from our oppressors? Can we rely on outside help at all or is there something of greater significance here?

What are some of our "Egypts" that we run to first before we consult our God?

Do you know of any lies that may be beckoning you to believe in them and shun the word of God?

What is God's mercy for obedience like according to Isaiah 30:18-26, 29?

To what time do you think Isaiah 30:27-28, 30 are referring?

How will Assyria respond to God's punishing blow according to Isaiah 30:31?

How will the Remnant respond to God's punishing blow on the Assyrians 30:32?

Where and what is "Topheth?" Use your Bible dictionaries for this.

Who has "Topheth" been prepared for according to Isaiah 30:33?

For whom was the lake of fire, referred to in Revelation 20:10,13-15 and, 21:8, originally prepared?

## Day 3 – Woe to Those Who Go Down to Egypt for Help! – Isaiah 31

In Deuteronomy 17, God tells the people that when they are in the land and they have kings who rule over them, the kings were not to multiply horses.

Solomon, David's Son, who ruled over the Israelites, greatly multiplied horses during his reign. Where do you think Solomon got these horses?

Do you think Solomon gave up on God and turned to the gods of this world?

It appears that everything God had asked of the Israelites was for the purpose of guiding them back to Himself, not away from Him.

Read, once again, the woe to those who go down to Egypt for help in Isaiah 31:1

Will the Egyptians protect Jerusalem?

Who will protect Jerusalem and how will He protect it according to Isaiah 31:3-5?

How do flying birds (birds of prey) protect their young?

Is there any hope for those who have asked Egypt for help and yet are truly repentant of their sin according to 31:6?

Once again, who or what will destroy the Assyrians according to 31:7-9?

Who or what is this sword? See Galatians 6:17?

How will The Messiah, King Jesus, destroy the enemy who comes against His Jerusalem in the last days? See Revelation 19:11-16.

## Day 4 – Coming: The King, a Time of Trial and the Holy Spirit! – Isaiah 32

Please read and work on your double-spaced worksheet for Isaiah chapter 32. There is a shifting back and forth between the Millennial Kingdom and the current condition of the Israelites at this time. Where are the shifts in time located in chapter 32? Mark key words and key word phrases: I marked righteously, righteousness and peace, peaceful and joyful, jubilant. You can mark others that you see. Can you make a list of the conditions during the Millennial Kingdom from verses 32:1-5 and 32:15-20? What is the contrast between the fool/rogue and the noble man in 32:6-8?

When will the Spirit be poured out upon those who are of the faithful Remnant according to 32:15?

What will be the result of this Spirit being poured out upon the Israelites in 32:15-18?

Is the Spirit being poured out here in Isaiah 32 the same time period as the Spirit being poured out in Joel 2:28-32?

Has this" pouring out of the Holy Spirit" happened in history as of yet?

# Day 5 – Final Woe to the Destroyer – Isaiah 33

Please read Isaiah 33 and work on your double-spaced worksheet for this chapter. What is this final woe and to whom is it addressed? What will God do to them and when will He do it? Mark key words and word phrases. I marked woe, remnant or references to the remnant, and covenant. You may mark other key repeated words and word phrases.

To whom will God be gracious in 33:2? What will He be to those He is gracious to in 33:2?

Can you find at least three benefits to daily walking with your God in Isaiah 33:2-6?

Who is the "he" of verse 33:8?

Is this "he" in the current time of the Israelites of Isaiah's day or is "he" referring to someone of the future?
