

We need to wrap-up this last section on Isaiah chapter 28-39. There's a lot of reading and marking in this last section, so do a little more of this lesson each day or stretch it into seven days of study this week. It's a good idea to read through this last lesson before you begin so that you know how much time it's going to take and you can pace yourself.

## Appendix A

First off, we are going to look at Appendix A found in the back of your guide. Appendix A is for writing down everything concerning the terms "the last days," "in that day," and "on that day." Some of you have already done this, but for you that have not, this will be your opportunity to catch up. Mark these words in some special way; I mark them with a rectangle colored in with brown pencil. I would suggest that you use only your double-spaced worksheets for doing this assignment. After you finish this lesson and you are certain of your observations, then you may transfer them to your Bible if you wish. I also would suggest that you write what will happen in "the last days," "in that day," and "on that day," in the words of the text and where in the text they are found. Here are three examples:

28:5 "in that day"

the LORD of hosts will become a beautiful crown  
And a glorious diadem to the Remnant of His people

29:18 And "on that day"

the deaf shall hear words of a book,  
And out of their gloom and darkness the eyes of the blind shall see

30:26b "on that day" the LORD binds up the fracture of His people and heals the bruise  
He has inflicted

This will take you quite some time if you write down the words of the text, but the rewards will be great, as you will be planting scripture in your mind as you do this. You also may want to add some notebook pages to Appendix A as this assignment will take up more space than you've been allotted on the page provided.

After you have finished this assignment, mark the references (for example, mark the "30:23-26" for Isaiah chapter 30, verses 23-26) in yellow, green, red, purple or blue pencil according to the following scheme:

If the words "the last days," "in that day," or "on that day," refer to the:

Millennial Kingdom, mark with yellow

Tribulation Period, mark with green

Possibly just prior to and into the end of the Tribulation Period, mark with red

Isaiah's time and may happen again in the last days, mark with purple

Fulfilled in His 1<sup>st</sup> coming and will be evident when He comes again, mark blue

Speaks of His 2<sup>nd</sup> coming, mark with orange

I marked the verses on the last page (Isaiah 30:23-26) in yellow.

### **Appendix B**

Secondly, Appendix B is for writing down everything that you learned about Babylon in this first part of Isaiah. Follow the same rules as above, writing down the words of the text and also recording where the text is found. There is one vague reference to Babylon at the end times in Isaiah 34:8-15 and one reference to two different Babylons of Isaiah's day in chapter 39. If you cannot remember about these two different Babylons, then go back to Isaiah Part 1, week 1. and Isaiah Part 2, week 5.

### **Appendix C**

Thirdly, Appendix C is for writing down all that you discovered in these 12 chapters that would be considered Messianic prophecies. Remember, one clue to finding these references is to look for a name of God revealed in the words. Follow the same rules as for Appendix A and B, writing down the "words of the text" and their references.

### **Appendix D**

Lastly, write down every thing you have learned about the Millennial Kingdom in chapters 28-39 in Appendix D.

### **Reread Isaiah 28-39**

Reread and write the major theme of chapters 28-35 at the top of the respective double-spaced worksheets. Some chapters have more than one theme. After you complete this assignment transfer your information to the Isaiah-theme-summary chart found also in the appendix if you have not already done so, noting the theme of Isaiah, the author, date written and segment divisions if you can. Finally, if you have not done this already in lesson one of Part 4, please read chapters 36-39 and write the theme or themes on the respective double-spaced worksheets for these chapters and on the Isaiah-theme-summary chart in the appendix. This reading may take you some time as we only looked at these chapters briefly in Part 2. These four chapters are a bridge between Isaiah 1-35 (judgment section of Isaiah) and Isaiah 40-66 (grace section of Isaiah) and are about Assyria trying to take Jerusalem during the reign of King Hezekiah. Hezekiah was a good king and God heard his prayers for protection. We will review these four chapters in between the two major divisions of Isaiah, chapters 1-35 and chapters 40-66 in class next week. Chapters 36 and 37 record the response of Hezekiah and the people of Jerusalem to the taunts of the Assyrian army. It also takes account of God's victory over the Assyrian troops readying for battle just outside of Jerusalem's walls. Chapters 38 and 39 have more to do with the coming Babylonian invasion that will soon take place on Jerusalem. There is a lot of material to cover in these chapters so again, please pace yourselves accordingly.

Now, look over all you have done with chapters 28-39. Can you read the text of chapters 28-39 and understand what you are reading? Write any thoughts you have in the space below:

As a final assignment this week, read Isaiah chapters 1-39 in one sitting. After you have finished reading, transfer all the chapter themes from Isaiah Parts 1,2, and 3 to the Isaiah-theme-summary chart found in Part 4's appendix. Do you have a sense of unity for this entire major section of chapters 1-39? I've given you hints along the way.

The next major section will cover chapters 40-66. It will be all about grace, grace, grace! Yeah! Cause I'm tire of judgment, judgment, judgment!
