Day 1 - Three Servants of the LORD - Isaiah 40-48

Nestled within Isaiah chapters 40-48 are references to three servants of the LORD. Today, your assignment is to read through all nine chapters and mark references to each of the servants. Two of the servants are described as servants; one is not. I mark my references to "servant" with a brown colored in box with a 1, 2, or a 3 above the brown box.

Who are the three servants? Where do the references start for each of the three servants? Please write chapter and verse.

Messiah – "My Servant" - Isaiah 42:1 Jacob (Israel) – My servant – Isaiah 41:8 Cyrus – My shepherd – Isaiah 44:28

Days 2-4– Attributes of God's Three Servants

As you reread chapters 41-48, place a list of attributes and anything else that you find in the margin of your corresponding double-spaced worksheets for each of the servants 1, 2, and 3. If you do this correctly, you will have a lot more to list than space in the margins. After you have completed this task, write your lists below in the respective spaces. You will find more information about these three servants dispersed throughout your reading of Isaiah 40-48. However, they will not be as easily connected to the individual servants as those verses that actually have the word "servant" in them. If you are sure the passage of Scripture you are reading is a reference to one of the three servants, include those in your list below, citing chapter and verse.

Servant of the LORD No. 1 – the Messiah

"My Servant" – Isaiah 42:1-9, 13-16

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus is called the Servant of Jehovah. What does Mark say about this Jesus in Mark 10:45?

What does Matthew say about Jesus in chapter 12:17-21?

Servant of the LORD No. 2 – Israel or Jacob - my servant

"But you, Israel, My servant, Jacob whom I have chosen" -Isaiah 41:8-20

What contrast do you see between the coastlands or the ends of the earth in 41:5 and the servant of the LORD or Israel in 41:8-10?

What timeframe do you see surrounding Israel, God's servant, in 41:9?

Again, what timeframe do you see surrounding Israel, God's servant in 41:11-12?

Have these things ultimately come to pass for Israel at the present time?

What obvious comparison between Israel and God is God making by calling Israel, "you worm Jacob" in 41:14?

Again, what time frame do we see surrounding Israel, in Isaiah 41:18-19?

Isaiah 41:18-19 is beginning to happen in Israel today. Since Israel's return to the land in 1948, the desert has become a garden, and both the spring and fall rains have returned to the land. Israel will begin to see the hand of the LORD in all of this. And as this transformation of the land becomes more complete, those who are His will have to see His workmanship in all of it and they will return to Him in obedience (Isaiah 41:20).

"Who is blind but My servant?" - 42:18-25

"O Jacob," "O Israel," "My sons," "My daughters," "Everyone who is called by My name, and whom I have created for My glory, whom I have formed, even whom I have made," "You are My witnesses" "and My servant," "My chosen people" - 43:1-28

"O Jacob, My servant and you Israel, whom I have chosen," "My witnesses" - 44:1-8

"O Jacob," "Israel," "My servant," "My servant O Israel," "His servant" - 44:21-22, 26

How does God contrast the idols and Himself in these verses 44:1-20?

"Jacob My servant and Israel My chosen one" - 45:4

"His servant Jacob" - 48:20

Servant of the LORD No. 3 – Cyrus – My shepherd

"Cyrus His Anointed" - Isaiah 44:28 - 45:13

Does someone have to be saved to be God's servant?

Do you think Cyrus was saved?

What does the phrase "by a way he had not been traversing with his feet" mean in Isaiah 41:3? Does this verse refer to Cyrus?

Day 5 – Which Servant of the LORD has these Attributes? – Isaiah 52:13 through 53

Please read Isaiah 52:13 - Isaiah 53 at this time. I realize that this is outside the boundaries of this section of chapters 40-48. However, you do have double-spaced worksheets for chapters 52 and 53 in the appendix and for the sake of the theme of these three servants, please do this exercise here and now.

Which Servant of the LORD is Isaiah 53 referring to: Israel, Cyrus, or the Messiah? Some of the Jews today believe that their nation, is the <u>Servant of the LORD</u> spoken about here in these verses. Is there any evidence in the Scripture that these Jews are correct in their interpretation?

Do the same with this passage of Scripture as you have done for chapters 40-48. Make a list of the attributes of this Servant of the LORD found in chapter 52:13 through to the end of chapter 53.

Isaiah 48:22 and Isaiah 57:21

Please read these two verses. Again, you have the double-spaced worksheet for chapter 57, so do this exercise here and now. Why do you think the first verse in **48:22** is repeated in **57:21**?

This verse, **Isaiah 48:22** can act as a bookend for the end of this first division and the beginning of the next division of nine chapters. This verse is repeated in **Isaiah 57:21**, possibly again acting as a bookend for the end of the second division and the beginning of the final division of nine chapters.

Are we Gentile or Jewish Believers called to be God's servants in this generation? If so, which attributes are we to display in our lives? Will He have to put us into the crucible in order to refine us?
