Appendix C

Appendix C is for writing down all that you discovered in these 9 chapters that would be considered Messianic prophecies. Remember, one clue to finding these references is to look for a name of God revealed in the words. Also write down the “words of the text” and their references. Even though this section has the theme of God the Father, there are also many references to the Christ.

Appendix E

Appendix E is similar to Appendix C and akin to the Messianic Prophecies. For this assignment you will need to write down all the names of God (Father, Son, or Holy Spirit) in chapters 40-48 and also the attributes of God not revealed to us through a name. Again, write down the “words of the text” and their references.

Reread Isaiah 40-48

Reread and write the major theme of each chapter (40-48) at the top of the respective double-spaced worksheets. Some chapters have more than one theme. After you complete this assignment transfer your information to the Isaiah-Theme-Summary chart found also in the appendix if you have not already done so, noting the theme of Isaiah, the author, date written and segment divisions if you can. Finding themes for these chapters may be more difficult than in the first four parts of Isaiah. Use your class discussion worksheets and daily subheadings within the text of the study to give you clues.

Appendix F
