The leader of the European residents of Jerusalem in the movie <u>The Kingdom of Heaven</u> asked the leader of the Muslims "What is Jerusalem worth?" The Muslim leader was quick to respond, "nothing." He walked a few paces, turned back to the other leader and smugly said, "everything."

Day 1 - What is Jerusalem Worth? - Comparison God, Jews, Muslims, Christians

How important is Jerusalem to God? How important is Jerusalem to Israel? How important is Jerusalem to the Muslims? How important is Jerusalem to the Christians? Today, I would like you to pull from your study of the Scripture, from your study of history, and from your understanding of current events and compare/ contrast Jerusalem's importance to God and each of these people groups.

Days 2 - 3 - Jerusalem and the Temple Site: Scriptural Background – Genesis through Daniel

There are three references in the Scripture that can be considered "Zion." Obviously, Jerusalem is Zion in most of the Scriptural text. Sometimes however, Zion can be referring to the Israelite people or the land itself. Today we are going to take a look at some background scripture for Jerusalem as Zion.

Genesis 22 – please read all of Genesis 22, and answer the following questions:

Where did God tell Abraham to go with his only son in Genesis 22:2?

What was Abraham to do with Isaac on that mountain in the land of Moriah?

On what day did Abraham raise his eyes and see the place he was to sacrifice Isaac?

Who were Abraham's servants to wait for in return in Genesis 22:5?

Remember that Jerusalem is a city on a hill.

Joshua 15, 18 – In Joshua 15, the boundaries of the land given to the tribe of Judah are explained. Joshua 15:8 says this, "Then the border went up the valley of Ben-hinnom to the slope of the Jebusite on the south (that is, Jerusalem); and the border went up to the top of the mountain which is before the valley of Hinnom to the west, which is at the end of the valley of Rephaim toward the north." Joshua 15:63 tells us this about the Jebusite city of Jerusalem, "now as for the Jebusites, the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the sons of Judah could not drive them out; so, the Jebusites live with the sons of Judah at Jerusalem until this day." In Joshua 18:21-28, it looks like the tribe of Benjamin could claim the city of Jerusalem. Later in Jewish history, we see the tribe of Judah almost completely engulfing the tribe of Benjamin. However, neither those from the tribe of Judah nor from the tribe of Benjamin were able to take the city of Jerusalem from the Jebusites until David came to power.

Why does the writer of the book of Joshua tell us so much detail about this city?

2 Samuel 5:7, 1 Chronicles 11:4-9 – please read just these verses.

Jerusalem did not really belong to either the Jews (those from Judah) or the Benjamites before David the king conquered it. In the 2 Samuel 5 passage, Jerusalem is called the "stronghold of Zion." Both of these passages of Scripture refer to this city as the City of David.

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It furthermore tells us that David built the city all around, from the Millo even to the surrounding area and David became greater and greater because the LORD was with him. Reading on into 2 Samuel 6-7, God talks to David about the city of Jerusalem and how He intends to build His permanent dwelling place there. The temporary dwelling place for God had been the traveling tabernacle that had accompanied the Israelites in the desert on their trek from Egypt to the Promised Land and it had been residing in Shiloh. David brought the ark of the covenant (where the Shekinah Glory resided between the two cherubim) to Jerusalem, God's chosen place of residence with Man on this earth. All the Israelites were to worship God in Jerusalem.

<u>2 Samuel 24:18-25</u> – Please read this passage of Scripture. David acquired this threshing floor for the altar. This land became the place for the temple mount in Jerusalem. Write your thoughts below.

Nehemiah 4:7-22 – Please read this passage and write down your thoughts. This was after Isaiah's time and after the Southern Kingdom had been taken into captivity. The Remnant had returned to Jerusalem to rebuild the walls of the city.

<u>The City at the Time of Antiochus Epiphanes</u> – After Alexander's Greek empire was divided between his four generals at his death, Jerusalem became the go-between for General Ptolemy's Egyptian-held empire and General Selucid's Syrian-held empire. Antiochus Epiphanes, a Selucid king, slaughtered a pig on the altar of God in the Temple in Jerusalem. If you would like to read more about this, see Daniel's prophecy in the 11th chapter of his book. Also, Josephus sheds some secular light on this.

<u>The City at the Time of Christ</u> - This city was under Roman rule at the time of Christ. However, the Roman government had appointed an Edomite or an Idumean (remember Jacob's brother Esau was the father of the Edomites) as the local ruler. His name was Herod. Herod was known as the great builder and so he enlarged and beautified the Temple and the Temple mount at that time.

<u>The City after 70 A.D.</u> – the Romans leveled Jerusalem in 70 A.D., including the Temple. Not one stone of the Temple was left upon another. The Jewish people were dispersed to all places in the world. This period of time was called the Diaspora. From this point on the Jews had neither a Temple nor the sacrificial system nor records of their linage back to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

<u>The City Today</u> – see notes from class discussion. The city today is divided into parts for the differing parties. There is a mosque called the Dome of the Rock that is presently sitting on the site of the mount for the Jewish Temple.

Day 4 – God's Place of Earthly Residence will be Glorified – Double-spaced worksheet - Isaiah 60
